




or lightly sprayed 82 Hellgrün




RLM 75 gear door (or possibly

**A/C 1 Fw 190D-9, W.Nr 500777**, flown by arguably the most famous of all the WW II Luftwaffe pilot, Hans Ulrich Rudel. Stab./SG2, Grossenheim, Germany, April, 1945. Besides being a historical a/c flown by Rudel, camouflagewise this a/c is a real winner. It appears to have it's original RLM 76 fuselage coat overpainted with RLM 997, while the upper fuselage colors are RLM 81/82 or a faded 83. Notice the rudder is in RLM 76 with 83 splotches. The original fuselage crosses and rank/unit markings have been carefully preserved and remain on a RLM 76 patch. Flying uppersurfaces seem to be RLM 75/82 or 83 while the lower surfaces are shown in different ways in two of our sources. One depicts them in RLM 997 while the other show the front half in RLM997 and the rear half in 76. Black spinner with a thin White spiral and landing gear covers in Gray or possibly a dark tarnished metal. Blown canopy on this colorful a/c. Until the final picture shows up, nobody will know. Do you?






**A/C 2 Fw 190D-9, W.Nr 500568**, possibly III./KG(J) 27. Very similar in appearance to a/c 3 in our earlier sheet 48-719, where the color RLM 99 is discussed. Aircraft is camouflaged in the colors RLM82/83/99/76. RLM 99? lower and fuselage sides with 82/83 uppers with very few splotches on the front cowling and vertical fin/rudder. Natural Metal lower wing with RLM 76 ailerons and lower stabilizers. Other sources indicate the front half of the lower wing is RLM 997 with Natural Metal on the rear half. Upper flying surfaces seem to be painted in RLM 82/83. Black spinner with a White spiral. Green/White checkered fuselage band and Black 12 added the final touch to this a/c


## A/C 3



**Fw 190D-9, W, Nr. 211164**, belonging to Stab./JG 2 or Stab./JG 6 and found at Prague-Ruzyně, Czechoslovakia, May 1945. Very typical camouflage for most D-9 a/c, consisting of RLM 83 all over the upper fuselage with a small section of the spine in RLM 75. A very light mottling of 81 or 83 showed on the Yellow fuselage band. Vertical fin/rudder splotched [RLM 81]. Upper flying surfaces were camouflaged in RLM 75/83 with 76 lower surfaces. Spinner seems to be RLM 70, but Black would also be an acceptable choice. Notice the almost hard demarcation line between the upper and lower surfaces of the engine cowling.
