


T-38C Heritage Schemes

ILIADESIGN 148

Northrop T-38C of the 50th Flying Training Squadron (FTS), based at Columbus AFB. The 50th FTS began as the 50th Pursuit Squadron Jan. 5, 1941.



T-38C of the 90th FTS based to Sheppard AFB. The scheme commemorates the P-47 Thunderbolts of the 90th Pursuit Group in the CBI in WW II.



T-38C of the 469th FTS based at Sheppard AFB. It is finished in the scheme of a Viet Nam War era F-4 Phantom.



T-38C of the 586th FTS from Holloman AFB wearing a special "D-Day" scheme in honour of its ancestor 586th Bomb Group, which flew B-26s in WW II.



T-38C of the 49th FTS from Columbus AFB. The aircraft commemoates the Lockheed P-38 Lightnings of the 49th Fighter Squadron in WW II.

INVASION STRIPES
The 'invasion' stripes on aircraft of the 49th and 586th FTS are a total of 50" overall width, with each black and white stripe thus being 10" wide.
In 1/48 scale this translates to an overall width of 1.04" (26.4 mm), with each stripe being .208" (5.28 mm).



Insignia above the left wing, and below the right wing.



No USAF on the lower surface.

Insignia above the left wing, and below the right wing.

Small yellow USAF on top of the right wing.

Black & white "invasion" stripes wrap around the fuselage and wings.

Note the stripes are farther inward than on the 49th FTS aircraft above.

Small white USAF on top of the right wing.

Small black USAF below the left wing.
