



"Lullaby for a Dream" was the name for this famous art work that appeared in a famous magazine around 1941. The crew of this a/c didn't waste a minute decorating their beautiful airplane with it. This Natural Metal P-51D of the 360FS/356FG, was flown by Lt. James A. Hickey. Red spinner, canopy frame, rudder and cowling with Blue Diamonds decorated this colorful a/c. Wedge style rear view mirror is attached to a Natural metal windshield frame. No theatre ID bands on this a/c. Shrouded exhaust stacks. The data block (part 48) sort of showed underneath "lullaby", but we didn't want to print them together and risk ruining her. Your choice to apply part 48 or not.



Aircraft #2

To facilitate the painting of the Red nose, we are providing you with templates. Simply transfer this template to your favorite masking material. Depending on which side you use, you can mask the Red or the Natural Metal area. Notice that all these a/c had individual styles for the Red section as well as the Diamond pattern, and it is important that you use the correct item in both instances. We hope you enjoy building these beautiful a/c. Who said that only a/c with crosses were colorful???



Lady Doris, flown by Capt. Orvill L. "Ray" Burwell of the 360 FS/356 FG. Standard markings for this group, consisting of Red canopy frame, rudder, full theatre ID bands (modelers must trim decal B to fit only the vertical fin), cowling with Blue Diamonds and Blue circles around the spinner decorated this beautiful a/c. Twin horn style rear view mirrors were attached to the natural metal windscreen frame. Notice that part of the s/n was on an Aluminum doped square on the rudder. Shrouded exhaust stacks. Friends, they don't make them more colorful than this !!!!
